## 1. **Description of Position**:

The ULB offers a dynamic and international research environment and attracts many first-class European and non-European students. The Faculty of economics and management has three research centers, holds several research seminars every week and participates in many international research and teaching networks.

Candidates must hold a Ph.D. in Economics and are expected to have an active research agenda, outstanding publication record, and a commitment to excellent teaching. Applicants will be expected to teach at both undergraduate and graduate level. Teaching can be in English, but ability to teach in French will be considered a plus.

The successful candidate will be invited to apply for a grant from the European Research Council (ERC) and for any sources of outside funding (FNRS, Europe, Regional funds, etc...) enabling them to develop their research. The ULB Research Department will assist with applications.

## • Description of Scientific and Pedagogical Objectives:

The chair holder is expected to teach two courses per semester. Two courses, Political Economy and Development Policies, will be part of the programs of the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences and the two other courses are in Development Economics in the Master program in SBS\_EM. One of the Master courses can be waived in the first two years.

- The course in Political Economy will be in the BA program of the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (FSP) and will be taught in French from 2017 onwards
- The course on Development Policies will be part of the compulsory core program of the Master in Development Studies and will be open also to students from other Masters of the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences and of the Faculty of Economics. This course

- will address the main theories of Development Economics, case studies of development policies, and transversal topics (e.g. Unequalities and development, Experimental Economics applied to various development issues...).
